The Theban Plays The three Theban plays tell the continuing story of Oedipus and his daughter Antigone in the following order: (1) Oedipus Rex (2) Oedipus at Colonus, and (3) Antigone \*\*Sophocles wrote the plays years apart and out of sequence

### **Drama by Sophocles**

plays are based on the legend of Oedipus (DdPE-pEs), the doomed Theban king who unknowingly killed his father and married his mother Antigone (Bn-tGgPE-nC) is the daughter of Oedipus Family Feud As the play begins, Antigone and her sister, Ismene (Gs-mCPnC), recall their dead father Upon discovering the truth about his marriage, Oedipus

Sophocles' most famous plays are often grouped under the epithet 'The Theban Plays' and include (in the chronology of the myths themselves) , Oedipus at Colonus and Oedipus Rex Antigone While these plays appear to form a trilogy, each is the sole surviving play from three separate trilogies nine plays in all, six of which are lost

1 Oedipus, once King of Thebes, was the father of Antigone and Ismene, and of their brothers Polyneices and Eteocles Oedipus unwittingly killed his father, Laios, and married his own mother, Iocaste When he learned what he had done, he blinded himself and left Thebes
